

If you only have 15 minutes free today...

1) Read your child a story and give them lots of loving cuddles – we all need them at this time!

2) Write down the numbers 1-20 and ask your child to order them in the correct order. Try timing them for an extra challenge!

3) Practise writing the tricky words 'he' 'she' 'you' and 'are'. Ask your child to write the word down, then cover it up and ask them to write it again. Repeat 3 times.

Literacy

Prior to the session, write the sentences below. Read and order them together, explaining that they are the stages of making chocolate. Ask your child to draw a picture to match each sentence.

Pods grow on cocoa trees in the sun.

Farmers cut the pods down with a sharp knife and cut them open.

The beans and pulp are put out to dry in the sun for 4-7 days.

The beans are roasted.

At a factory, they mix the soft insides of the bean with sugar and milk to make chocolate.

They use a mould to make a chocolate bar and send them to shops.

Maths

Make your own number 'chocolate cookies' like the ones below for numbers 0-10 or 20. Ask your child to order the cookies and write/match the numeral. Whilst they close their eyes, take one or two cookies away before asking them to identify the missing number (s).



Ask your child to select 2 cookies at random and find the total number of chocolate chips. Can they write/say the number sentence? "3 plus 5 is equal to 8" or $3+5=8$.

Super challenge: Can you find the total for 3 cookies? What cookies would you need to make a total of 9 chocolate chips?

Phonics – Tricky word

Today we are focusing on the tricky word 'she'. Ask your child to write it down and talk about which part is tricky (the letter 'e' is the 'tricky' part because it doesn't make the sound 'eh' like we have learnt so far). Now cover the word up, and ask them to write it again. Try this 3 times.

This little girl is called Violet and she is from the film 'Charlie and the Chocolate Factory'. Using the tricky word 'she' see if you can write 3 sentences about her, e.g. 'She has blue skin'.
