Help them where necessary. For today's mission you are in charge of working for Queen Elizabeth II. She has got lots of letters to respond to. But there is a problem! All of the punctuation (capital letters, full stops and question marks) has disappeared!

Your first job is to sort these sentences into statements (normal sentences) and questions so that the Queen knows which ones are which. You can write a Q next to questions and an S next to statements.

1. my name is ella and I am seven years old
2. do you have any pets
3. how many crowns do you have at buckingham palace
4. i think that you should visit my school next friday
5. what is your favourite part of being the queen
6. my birthday is on the 28th june and i will be nine years old
7. why do you keep important letters in a red box

Your second job is to fix these sentences for the queen! You will need to add in the missing capital letters. Remember, every sentences **MUST** start with a capital letter. Proper nouns like I, names of people and places, days of the week and months of the year also need capital letters.

You will also need to put full stops on the end of the statements and question marks on the ends of the questions. Good luck!

Mission: Can I write number sentences to help me answer addition and subtraction word problems?

If you do not have a printer you or your child can read out the word problems and write the number sentences on a piece of scrap paper.

Teacher Tip: Children may wish to use objects, fingers or a number line to help them answer the word problems. Remind you child that when we add the number is going to get bigger and when we subtract the number is going to get smaller.

	Word problem	+ or -	Number sentence and answer
	First there were 10 princess in the castle. Then 1 of the princesses got married and moved into her prince's castle. How many princess are in the castles now?		
	An old king lived with 10 dogs, 4 parrots and 7 fish. How many pets did he have altogether?		
	Queen Elizabeth II had 8 pearl necklaces. She gave 5 of her necklaces away. How many necklaces does she have now?		
	King Henry VIII had 16 gold coins. One day he went into town and bought a new horse for 3 gold coins. How many coins does he have now?		
	Queen Elizabeth II has 38 gems in her crown. Unfortunately, 5 of her gems fell out of her crown. How many does she have now?		
	<p>Answers: $10-1=9$ $10+4+7=21$ $8-5=3$ $16-3=13$ $38-5=33$</p> <p>Extension: Can you write the number sentence and answer to this word problem? Queen Elizabeth II had 28 pet dogs. On Tuesday one of her dogs had 8 puppies but she decided to give 6 to her children. How many dogs does she have now? $28+8-6=30$</p>		
<p>Topic Mission: Day 4</p>	<p>Today you are going to make a time capsule – like a message for the future! A time capsule is usually a box/bottle filled with things from the present day (now). You can then hide it in your home or burry it underground. The idea is that a few years later you can dig it up or get it out and find out what life was like years ago.</p> <p>Historians (people whose job it is to research, analyse and study history) often find time capsules from the past and use them to learn about what life was like then. Today you will need to use a box or bottle (you could for example use an empty cereal box). You may wish to decorate the box like some of the ideas below or you may wish to leave it plain.</p>		

You can then put things in such as:

- Your diary entry from today and yesterday's writing missions
- A toy you like (but don't mind not having for a while)
- The packaging of your favourite food
- A photograph
- Things you have collected on walks to show where you have been in this time (leaves, twigs etc).
- Pictures you have drawn
- Today's newspaper

Your next job is to find somewhere to hide it! Some people dig holes and hide them under the ground. Remember don't look back at it until next year – if you can remember too! Maybe set the date in the diary.
