
Read this information about Windsor castle and answer the questions

Windsor Castle is the oldest and largest occupied castle in the world. It is open to visitors throughout the year and is based in the county of Berkshire.

Founded by William the Conqueror in the 11th century, it has since been the home of 39 monarchs. Queen Victoria spent most of her time at the castle during her reign.

Unfortunately in 1992 the castle was destroyed by a huge fire and it took 5 years to restore the castle.

Today The Queen spends most of her private weekends at the Castle.
