**(Answers will vary - accept any reasonable scared or upset feeling).

**He put on her nightgown and got into her bed.**

6. Why did the wolf dress up as Granny?

**To try to trick Little Red Riding Hood and eat her up.**

7. What did Little Red Riding Hood notice was different about Granny in bed?

**She noticed that Granny had big ears, big eyes and big teeth.**

8. Describe the wolf using three adjectives.

**(Answers will vary - accept any 3 reasonable adjectives to describe the wolf)  
I think the wolf was sneaky, scary and clever.**

9. How did the woodcutter know to come to the house?

**The woodcutter heard Little Red Riding Hood scream and ran to the house.**

10. What do you think was the moral (message) of the story?

**The story warns children that you should not talk to strangers or tell them where you are going.**

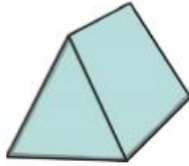

## 3D Shapes



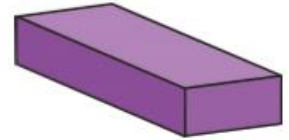
square-based pyramid



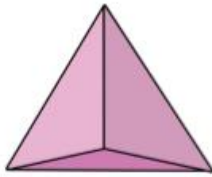
triangular prism
