
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dreaded Fizzy Drink Fizzer.

How many people are in the queue?




## Challenge 2

$$50 + \text{green triangle} = 100$$


$$\text{yellow circle} + \text{green triangle} + \text{blue square} = 100$$

What is the value of the blue square?


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## Challenge 4
