NOT because he was a rich prince or she was in love with him – she did not know he was a prince, and was not yet in love with him.</i></p> <p>Why could she not be with the prince? <i>She lived in the water and he lived on the land.</i></p> <p>Why could Sirenetta not tell the prince who she was? <i>The sea witch took her voice as payment for giving her feet.</i></p>
