### **Queen Elizabeth II**

Our Queen, Queen Elizabeth II, became the longest-reigning monarch (King or Queen) in British history in September 2015 with an amazing 64 years on the throne and counting!

#### **Becoming The Queen**

Elizabeth II became Queen of Great Britain and Northern Ireland when her dad – King George VI – died in February 1952. King George had no sons or brothers who could be king, so Elizabeth, King George's eldest daughter had to become queen. The next year, on 2<sup>nd</sup> of June 1953, Elizabeth II had her coronation, which is a special ceremony where she was given her real crown. This is a really big and important event with a parade. It was so important that many people in the UK bought their first television to watch it!

#### **Earlier Life**

The Queen was born in 1926 and had one younger sister, Margaret. They were the children of King George VI and his wife Queen Elizabeth (who later became the Queen Mother when her husband died). When she was younger, the Queen was a very active person and loved horse riding.

As a princess, Elizabeth wanted to join in and help with the Second World War effort, so in 1945, she joined the Auxiliary Territorial Service where she learned how to drive and fix vehicles. In 1947, she married Prince Philip from Greece and they went on to have four children: Charles (who will be our next King), Anne, Andrew and Edward. Even when planning her wedding, she thought about the war effort and used ration vouchers to buy the fabric for her wedding dress and the cake ingredients were a present from the Australian Girl Guides.

#### **Still Busy!**

The Queen had her 94<sup>th</sup> birthday in April 2020 and she is still going strong. She still works almost every day. She reads about 300 letters a day from people, attends meetings with important people, presents medals or awards, signs official papers, visits places and goes to events. She also reads all about what goes on in parliament every day.

Elizabeth II is not only the longest reigning monarch in British history, but is also the most enduringly popular. She has appeared in many works of fiction (such as Roald Dahl's BFG) and is seen as a symbol of the UK. Many people look up to her as a strong and capable leader who has navigated a rapidly changing world since World War II.

Suggested answers are in italics.</b></p> <p>When did Elizabeth II become queen?  <i>2<sup>nd</sup> June 1953.</i></p> <p>How long has Elizabeth been queen for?  <i>68 years.</i></p> <p>What is the name of Elizabeth’s daughter?  <i>Princess Anne.</i></p> <p>Why do you think the Queen wanted to join the army in World War II?  <i>To help people/to show she was fighting for her country/other reasonable answer.</i></p> <p>What reason does the text suggest that lots of people first bought televisions in Britain?  <i>So that they could watch the Queen’s coronation ceremony.</i></p> <p>Write three things that the Queen does as part of her job.  <i>Any three of: reads about 300 letters a day from people, attends meetings with important people, presents medals or awards, signs official papers, visits places and goes to events, reads about parliament.</i></p> <p>Why do you think the Queen reads about what happens in parliament every day?  <i>She needs to know how people are deciding to run the country for her job (or similar).</i></p> <p>Do you think Queen Elizabeth II is a good ruler? Explain your reasoning.  <i>Your child’s answer, with reasons.</i></p>
<p><b>Writing Mission:</b> 30 minutes</p>	<p>Your second writing task this week is to choose one of the kings or queens you have learned about in your reading missions this week, or research one of your own, and create a non-chronological report about that person.</p> <p>A non-chronological report provides facts about something. We made one about wolves, and about the Romans. You should include:  Headings and subheadings  Expanded noun phrases  A picture of your subject (you could draw this or find a photo)</p> <p>There is an example of a non-chronological report at the end of the timetable.</p> <p>Today you should decide on your headings and what information might be placed under each. These could be: Early life, what they did as ruler, how they died, what they left behind (a word that means this is “legacy”). Tomorrow you will write this up and decorate your report.</p>


**Day 4**

Their template looks like this:



Some crowns are more complex. This one is made from metal wire and bead crystals: <https://tikkido.com/blog/elven-style-crown-tutorial>  
They use a thicker wire for the main crown and the thin wire to secure the bead crystals into it.



Wire can also be used to create crowns out of sticks and paint them, if you wanted a more “forest fairy” look.

It also mostly uses paper, which you are more likely to have than wire!
