



Vocabulary	
<b>Still life</b>	Something that is lifeless and doesn't move.
<b>digital</b>	Electronic technology that generates, stores, and processes data.
<b>Line drawing</b>	Any image that consists of distinct straight or curved <b>lines</b> placed against a (usually plain) back-ground
<b>thin</b>	With little thickness or depth.
<b>thick</b>	<b>Something that is</b> broad or bulky or decidedly not thin.
<b>Observe</b>	To notice or perceive (something) and register it as being significant.
<b>shape</b>	The external form, contours, or outline of someone or something.
<b>Illustrator</b>	A person who draws or creates pictures for magazines, books, advertising, etc.

**I need to know (continued):**

She graduated from Bristol UWE and since then has been very successful in designing a range of illustrations such as print and pattern designs, murals, fashion and stationery designs.

I need to know that still life is something that doesn't move and is something that can be drawn using a first hand observation. Different ideas on how to replicate the still life can be explored and recorded using a range of mediums to create an image.

Digital art can be created and recorded using a digital platform like the sketchbook app to explore line drawings with varying lines of thickness.

**I need to do:**

Use sketchbooks to collect/ record ideas and use them to review and revisit ideas.  
 Open an app on the iPad.  
 Use a simple graphics package) sketchbook) to create a line drawing.  
 Explore ideas using digital sources .  
 Identify artists who have worked in a similar way to their own.  
 Record visual information using digital cameras.  
 Name and draw lines from observation.  
 Create lines of varying thickness- thin and thick.

**Prior knowledge (development matters):**

I need to know how to hold and use a pencil correctly and show good control and coordination in large and small movements. I need to know how to operate simple equipment in order to safely use and explore a variety of materials and tools. These materials and tools can be used in varying techniques to explore colour, design, texture, form and function.

**I need to know:**

That you can create art work using digital sources to record it on a digital platform. Artists that produce digital art work are called digital illustrators and I know that a local digital artist is called Ruby Taylor. She has designed illustrations for an international retailer of body, face, fragrances and home based products called l'Occitane.
