Thank you to Staff and Parents

I hope that you are all well! We have had a few COVID related closures recently but as of Friday this week we are all looking forward to being back together again. Just a few additional points to communicate this week:

Early pick ups and drop offs

Please can you try your very best to drop your child off at the gate between 8:30 and 9:00am and then pick them up from the playground between 3:10pm and 3:30pm. We are seeing an increasing number of children being picked up early or dropped off late, and while we appreciate that this is occasionally necessary in an emergency situation, or in the event of a medical appointment we must be aware that this increases the contact that our office staff are having with families. We have a commitment to the safety and well-being of our staff and want to protect them as much as possible, especially during the lockdown period. I will be monitoring footfall into the academy office in the coming weeks, and thank you once again for your support in what we are trying to achieve.

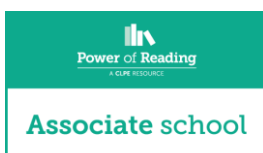
Fourteen days of isolation

A few parents have been in touch questioning isolation periods set by the academy in the event of a class closing down. The guidance is based on being fourteen days of isolation from the last contact with the positive case. If the news of the positive case takes a while to reach us (this is often the case with slow test results), then the period of isolation will be reduced. Please be assured that we are now practically experts in this field, but for each individual case we do go through a rigorous data and calendar tracking exercise as an academy, with the national crisis team in Oasis, and we also take guidance from the DfE. I hope this helps to clarify the guidance we are working within if you were unsure.
